# Citizen Volunteer Unit

- 30 years in existence
- Open to those 18 years of age or older who are able to complete the training and are willing to complete at least 16 hours of service per month
  - Recently awarded three 25-year service pins; two 20-year pins; and nine 10-year pins
- Assists the department in the following ways:
  - Vacation House Checks – Very important to the citizens of Redlands
  - Parking lot surveillance
  - Traffic control
  - Assists the RPD with the 32 major special events in the city which would not be possible without them or the support of the RPCF
- Training
  - Complete an interview and a ride-along
  - 8 – 10 hour academy in classroom
  - 18 4-hour field sessions
  - Commitment to a minimum of 16 hours of service a month



# Citizen Volunteer Unit

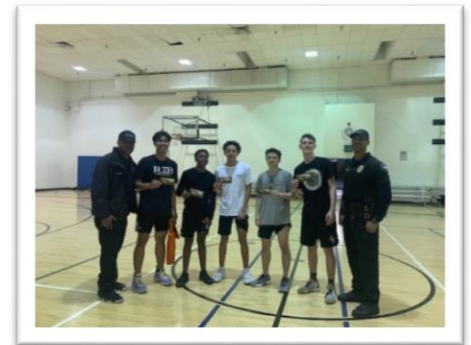
- Success Stories
  - In 2019, the Citizen Volunteers donated approximately 12,000 hours of service to the Redlands Police Department and the community, the equivalent of approximately \$240,000!
  - Volunteers recently assisted the Facilities & Community Services Department's Code Enforcement in obtaining photographs which assisted them in clearing about 75 backlogged property inspections
- How the RPCF has helped:
  - Donated a much-needed new vehicle in 2019
  - Helps the Citizen Volunteers maintain self-sufficiency (through the 365 Club) → Minimal funding/operational costs to the City of Redlands



# Midnight Hoopz



- Established in 2005 in collaboration with the RPD after Second Baptist Church Pastor Anthony Green (current RPCF board member) recognized the need to have a safe place for at-risk youth on Friday nights.
- Held at the Community Center every third Friday of the month from 9:00 p.m. – 12:00 a.m.
- Open to all who would like to participate and who show respect and good sportsmanship.
- Primarily attracts pre-teens, teens, young adults, and families who come out to support their children during the tournaments.
- Thanks to a generous donation from the RPCF and the extra efforts of RPCF Treasurer Joe Walloch, several youth were taken to an LA Lakers and LA Clippers game at the Staples Center
- How the RPCF assists:
  - Provides funds to help cover operational costs (referees and gift cards for tournament winners)
  - Helps with other events as requested
- Music Changing Lives has assisted with events and provided live performances



# Redlands Emergency Services Academy (RESA)

- Established in 1999 to offer career and educational development for students graduating from high school who have an interest in public services as a career
- The program:
  - Provides a free week long academy to qualifying students
  - Participation in hands-on fire and police activities
  - Provides instruction in the importance of high ethics and moral behaviors, leadership, team work
  - Promotes the importance of education
  - Promotes pride of home and community and the importance of being active in your community through community service
- Program requirements:
  - Application, completion of an essay, and interview
  - Commit to one week without access to any technology or phone
  - Open to all seniors graduating from high school with an interest in public service careers



# Redlands Emergency Services Academy (RESA)

- Community Partners
  - San Manuel Band of Mission Indians; University of Redlands; Toyota of Redlands; Crafton Hills College; SB Sheriff's Department; SB Count Fire Department; Redlands Unified School District; Redlands Optimist Club; Kiwanis Club of Redlands
  - Taco Shack; Chipotle Mexican Grill; Jerseys Pizza; Gourmet Pizza Shoppe; Jersey Mike's Subs; JoJo's Grill-A-Dog; Saverino's Italian Deli and Market, and local community members
- Success Stories
  - The officers and firefighters who administer the program are RESA graduates
  - Redlands Police Department has 13 RESA graduates as members of its team: 5 in the Explorer Program; 6 sworn officers; and 2 Community Service Officers
  - Redlands Fire Department has 9 RESA graduates as full-time Firefighter Paramedics and 7 Fire Explorers
  - There are other graduates who are working for fire departments, police departments and the US Forest Service across the country
  - Others have become physicians' assistants and nurses

# Street Smart Self-Defense Program



- Founded back in 2008 by current instructor RPD Corporal Alex Paredes with the purpose of providing students with a safe afterschool program that also:
  - Promotes self-defense which encompasses courtesy, justice, perseverance, self-control, and a fighting spirit. Also promotes leadership and self-confidence.
- Open to anyone six years of age or older who wishes to learn martial arts in a safe and healthy environment. Typical class size is approx. between 30 -40 students.
- Must participate in class for eight weeks before they receive a uniform
- Must be respectful and adhere to the code of conduct
- Special activities – pizza parties!
- The Foundation provides for equipment, uniforms, training mats, and pizza parties
- Program graduates have gone on to become: a chiropractic doctor; members of the United States Armed Forces; a law student at UCLA; and a student at UCR majoring in counseling after teaching martial arts to the younger students
